It is important that you are informed about your skin condition and proposed treatment including the potential benefits and risks involved. This disclosure is not meant to scare or alarm you; it is simply an effort to better inform you so that you may give or withhold your consent to the treatment program.

Hyaluronic Acid is a natural substance (a complex sugar) that stabilizes the skin structure, attracts and binds water, and contributes to the elastic properties of the skin that allow it to remain tight. Injections of Hyaluronic Acid into the skin are thought to replenish its natural support structures damaged by aging. Dermal fillers, such as Hyaluronic Acid injectable gel, are not a new treatment and are commonly used for filling in facial wrinkles and hollows, restoring facial volume to areas such as the cheeks and for lip augmentation.

Over time, Hyaluronic Acid injectable gel is gradually and naturally degraded in the human body. The effect of Hyaluronic Acid generally lasts for at least six months and in many circumstances longer. Follow-up treatments are needed to maintain the effects of Hyaluronic Acid.

Your doctor has prescribed Hyaluronic Acid injectable gel which may or may not contain a local anesthetic (0.3% lidocaine). Lidocaine is added to the formulation to increase comfort during injection and treatment. Your doctor will inform you which Hyaluronic Acid formulation has been prescribed for your treatment. Your Cosmetic Injector may also apply ice and/or an additional anesthetic agent to the area to be treated.

The range of outcomes will depend on dosage received and individual body response.

Outcomes can range from a full enhanced look to only a small variation from the baseline.

Injections of Hyaluronic Acid involves the risks outlined below. Although the risk of developing a serious complication is low, your Cosmetic Injector will monitor you closely, and should a complication occur, they will use their best judgment to do whatever is necessary to treat the problem.

Risks associated with the use of Hyaluronic Acid treatment are redness, swelling, bruising, tenderness or itching sensation to the treated area. These common side effects typically resolve within a few days. As with any piercing of the skin, there is an associated risk of infection. Rare side effects may also include visual disturbance including blindness.

Occasional cases of bumps and pimples, sometimes accompanied by redness, may occur a few days to a few weeks after the injection. These common side effects are temporary and generally disappear spontaneously in a few days. Very rare cases of reversible discolouration at the injection sites have also been described after Hyaluronic Acid injections. In addition, rare cases of abscess (hard and swollen sore that may contain pus), granuloma (small accumulation of tissue) and blocking of blood vessels causing damage to surrounding skin have been reported. If you experience any inflammatory or other reactions that last more than one week, you should notify your doctor or Cosmetic Injector immediately. If necessary, medical treatment may be prescribed and this will likely incur additional costs, for medications and possible specialist care.

A person who has had treatment with Hyaluronic Acid will usually recover from the procedure within one to three weeks. If you have previously had a dermal filler implanted (permanent or non-permanent) you should notify your LCA consulting doctor and your injector prior to receiving treatment with Hyaluronic Acid injectable gel. The possibility of unknown risks exists.

The safety of Hyaluronic Acid for use during pregnancy, in breastfeeding females or in patients under 18 years has not been established and therefore Hyaluronic Acid should not be used under these circumstances. Please notify your doctor if you have epilepsy, porphyria (enzyme disorder), any allergies (including hypersensitivity to hyaluronic

an autoimmune disease, a tendency to develop keloid scarring or are taking any medications (including anti-coagulant treatment or aspirin in high doses) or herbal or vitamin supplements.

It is important that you are informed about your skin condition and proposed treatment including the potential benefits and risks involved. This disclosure is not meant to scare or alarm you; it is simply an effort to better inform you so that you may give or withhold your consent to the treatment program.

I understand that:

Botulinum Toxin Type A treatment has been used for more than a decade in children and adults to treat therapeutic conditions such as migraines, involuntary facial muscle spasms and double vision due to eye muscle imbalances. In regards to cosmetic use, Injection of tiny amounts of Botulinum Toxin Type A weakens the treated muscle/s and helps prevent the formation of expression lines or wrinkles.

When small amounts of purified Botulinum Toxin Type A are injected into a muscle it causes weakness in that muscle. This takes 4 - 10 days to take effect and usually lasts 4 months but can be for a longer or shorter period.

The muscles injected will not function whilst the injection is effective (e.g.: you will not be able to frown if the muscles involved in frowning are injected) but this will reverse itself after a period of months at which time re-treatment is appropriate.

Side effects and complications of having Botulinum Toxin Type A treatment are possible but they are usually minimal.

Occasionally, headache, slight swelling, and/or bruising may occur after injection. A person who has had treatment with Botulinum Toxin Type A usually recovers on the day of treatment. Some people may experience bruising which may take up to two weeks to recover. An adjacent muscle may be weakened for several weeks after an injection, which may cause a temporary drooping of the eyelid or an eyebrow. This could last 2-3 weeks.

You should not rub the injected area immediately after the treatment.

You should remain upright for 4 hours after the injection.

Please notify your doctor if you have any allergies, autoimmune disease or are taking any medications or herbal supplements.

The safety of Botulinum Toxin Type A for use during pregnancy, has not been established and therefore Botulinum Toxin Type A should not be used under these circumstances. Please notify your doctor if you have any neurologic disease.

No guarantees can be made concerning the expected results. Several treatments may be necessary to complete the treatment.

Botulinum Toxin Type A is a 'Schedule 4' (prescription only) cosmetic injectable and will only be prescribed by your doctor after consultation with you (whether in person or by video - such as Skype™).
